Each year, as April approaches, there is much excitement in our area as we focus on the opening of the famed cherry blossoms surrounding the Tidal Basin. During this first full month of Spring, we also enjoy the blooming of the flowering trees lining Leisure World Boulevard and the opening of flowers filling our landscape.

It is appropriate that the month of April is the time when trees and flowers begin to reach their peak opening because the name April comes from the Latin word *Aperire*, meaning "to open."

April is a month for *opening* a window and letting in fresh air. April is a season for *opening* your closet and bringing out Spring clothes. April is also a time for *us* to be *open* to seeing the beauty of God's creation and experiencing the goodness of God everywhere.

We are called to live lives that are open (*aperire*) to God's presence and blessings. Julian of Norwich wrote, "The purpose of prayer is to be fully open to God, and with God, in all things." When our hearts, minds, and spirits are open to God, we are most fully alive and operating at our best.

On Maundy Thursday we will join together to honor the great mandate of loving one another and remember the night that Jesus initiated The Lord's Supper.

Good Friday opens us to the shadow of the cross and the death of Christ.

Easter calls us to the ultimate *aperire* (opening) of the grave and victory over the enemies to being fully open such as fear, worry, darkness, and death.

As we journey through this meaningful month of April (*Aperire*) let us become more open (*aperire*) people. Open handed in working together in love. Open minded to respecting the differences of others. Let us open the doors of our hearts, and open the doors of The Inter-Faith Chapel, to welcome everyone.

This April, let us be open to God in everything, everywhere, all at once!

We praise you in this Easter season. Change our lives, change our hearts to be messengers of Easter joy and hope.


We make our prayer through Jesus Christ, our risen Lord forever.

SPRINGTIME APRIL BABY SHOWER


Sponsored by the Club to help the Homeless and Working Poor (CHWP) Wednesday, April 19 from 9:00 am to 12 Noon

HOLY WEEK WORSHIP SERVICES

PALM SUNDAY

April 2, 2023

10:00 AM

Palm Sunday commemorates the triumphal entry of Jesus into Jerusalem to celebrate the Passover. The gospels record the arrival of Jesus riding into the city while the crowds waved palm branches and spread them on the street to honor Him. The laying of palm branches was customary for a king and indicated that the dignitary was arriving in victory and triumph. However, immediately after this great time of celebration in the ministry of Jesus, He begins His journey to the cross.

A hand-crafted African palm cross will be given to each person who attends the service. Villagers near Masasi, Tanzania earn wages to support their families by weaving these crosses from palm leaves.

MAUNDY THURSDAY April 6, 2023

6:00 PM

Maundy Thursday is so called from the Latin *diem Christus mandatum* (the day of Christ's great mandate). After Jesus washed His disciples' feet, He gave them a new *mandate* or *command* to love one another. It was on this evening that Jesus shared the Passover Meal with His disciples, which the Church later adopted as "The Lord's Supper." During this unique service, we will receive Holy Communion through the ancient mode of intinction. The service will conclude with the stripping of the altar in preparation for the somberness of Good Friday.

April 7, 2023

Good Friday commemorates the crucifixion of Jesus and His death on Calvary. The service will include prayers, readings, music, and a message to provide meditation for us on this holy day.

EASTER SUNDAY


April 9, 2023

Easter Sunday is the most important annual religious festival of the Christian liturgical year. On this Sunday, we will celebrate the miracle of the Resurrection and a message proclaiming hope and life will be heard.

Holy Week Movie: THE ROBE Monday, April 3, @ 1:00 PM Fellowship Hall Running time: 2h 15m

The Robe offers a fictional account of the Roman centurion who gambled and won the garment Christ was wearing on the day of his crucifixion. It focuses on the Roman tribunal put in charge of carrying out the crucifixion of Jesus. The movie opens with a slave auction in Rome where Marcellus (played by Richard Burton) angers Caligula, the heir to Emperor Tiberius. Marcellus is separated from his true love Diana and sent to the most unpopular outpost in the empire, Jerusalem. Marcellus arrives just as Jesus enters Jerusalem for the Lost Support Diana gets Tiberius to recell.



enters Jerusalem for the Last Supper. Diana gets Tiberius to recall Marcellus, but his final task in Jerusalem is to lead the crucifixion of Jesus.

While carrying out his assignment, he winds up winning the robe that was taken from Jesus when he was put on the cross. Later, Marcellus, who's wracked by guilt for his part in the crucifixion, is assigned to track down Christians conspiring against the empire. When he finds some Christians and learns what they are really teaching, however, he becomes one.

This powerful story is similar to that of Paul who at first sought to persecute Christians but then became one. *The Robe* has many inspiring moments. It is a wonderful testament to the power of Christian faith. The cast of this film includes Richard Burton, Jean Simmons, and Victor Mature.

Monday at the Movies featuring: Amazing Grace Monday, April 17 at 1:00 p.m. in the Fellowship Hall Rating: PG / Running time: 1h 58m

Amazing Grace is based on a true story and portrays the life and work of the British politician and abolitionist campaigner William Wilberforce. This film also chronicles the faith journey of a man who struggled to reconcile his passion for justice and politics with his natural inclination to retreat into a secluded life of spiritual contemplation.

The movie opens as the 18th century is trailing to a close. Eight years of fruitless effort promoting abolition have left Wilberforce (a

junior member of Parliament in the House of Commons) demoralized and depleted. One observer comments that he's given his youth and his health to a failed cause. Chronic illness has forced Wilberforce to retreat to the home of his cousins Henry and Marianne Thornton to rest and reassess his wherewithal to keep championing an unpopular idea.

The Thorntons introduce Wilberforce to Barbara Spooner, a fiery young woman whose zeal for the abolition movement matches his own. And as he recounts his history to her, lengthy flashbacks fill in his backstory and introduce us to an idiosyncratic cast of supporting characters who play important roles in the battle against slavery.

Among these is the ex-slave trader turned pastor and musician John Newton, who serves as Wilberforce's mentor. The young reformer's best friend is William Pitt, whose political ambitions lead him to the position of prime minister at the tender age of 24. Pitt introduces Wilberforce to two other important reformers, the freethinking (and free-drinking) itinerant preacher Thomas Clarkson and an erudite former slave named Oloudah Equiano. Finally, an old fox coincidentally named Lord Fox switches sides after being convinced of Wilberforce's argument. The cagey older politician's help is invaluable as Wilberforce seeks to outmaneuver parliamentary nemeses Lord Tarleton and the Duke of Clarence.

April is Allergic Rhinitis Month

Allergic rhinitis is known as hay fever. It is an immune system response to environmental allergens like grass, pollen, dust and animal dander. Allergic rhinitis causes can be seasonal or perennial. Seasonal rhinitis is commonly caused by tree pollen, grass pollen, weeds, or mold spores in the spring, summer and fall. Peren-

nial or year round rhinitis is commonly caused from animal dander, cockroaches, house dust mites, mold and fungi. Some symptoms include nasal congestion, sneezing, nasal itching, postnasal drip, and loss of taste. Symptoms affecting the eyes and nose include facial itching, watery eyes, sore throat, facial pain, pressure, headache and discoloration under eyes. Mouth breathing and frequent awakening may lead to sleep difficulties and fatigue. Treatment includes antihistamines, hydrocortisone, decongestants and allergen avoidance.


Allergic rhinitis is not preventable but can be controlled by the following.

- Stay hydrated.
- Keep windows closed when pollen counts are high and use air conditioning if possible.
- Eliminate dust and animal dander from your home.

Consult an allergist or immunologist for allergy testing and medication recommendations.

Take care of yourself and enjoy your life now.


DOMINGO NIEVES


ELIZABETH NYANG
